Research reveals that UDL may have a positive impact on students' overall outcomes like academic achievements, engagement and also helps in behavioral improvement (Hall et al., 2020). A study (Krishan S & Sharma N, 2023) reveals that, teachers who implemented UDL principles, they got more engagement and higher motivation as well.
